#### Session 1: 8:30-9:30 AM

Block A: Improving Your Turf Grass Performance and Playability / Adam Thoms, Iowa State <u>University</u>

Victim recognition is easily the most important aspect of a lifeguard's job. This session will address recognition failure and the factors that contribute to this lapse. We will explore the misconceptions associated with victims, as well as share videos to support these preconceived stereotypes. In-service training activities and drills will be shared to enhance and reinforce recognition.

## Block B: Tough Decisions / Margaret Smith, YouExcelNow Presented by LSI

Supervisors and leaders must be keenly in tune with co-workers and subordinates as it relates to working through tough decisions. These include discipline, termination, poor performance, setting objective rather than subjective performance measures. Regardless of your professional experience, gaining new knowledge of staff performance is vital.

Block A: How to Lose a 21 Million Dollar Drowning Lawsuit / Juliene Hefter, Safety First <u>Aquatics and Association of Aquatic Professionals</u>

A jury awarded \$21.5 million to the family of a 6-year-old boy who drowned in a pool when he had been part of a summer camp program on 6/17/14. He was pulled unresponsive from the pool and later died. Join the plaintiff expert to review what should have been done differently.

Block B: Homelessness in Parks / Rodney Dieser Ph.D, University of Northern Iowa

This session will provide strategies for how a community parks and recreation department can help homeless people transition to healthier environments. Three case studies will be provided.

## **Registration Fee**
